QUANTITATIVE RESULTS

Post-Training Survey on Attitudes: Likert Scale

1:Much less satisfied, 2:Less satisfied, 3:Same, 4:More satisfied, 5:Much more satisfied

Improved attitude towards relationship with co-parent - women: 4.23 (n = 469, SD = .79)

Improved attitude towards relationship with co-parent - men: 4.29 (n = 440, SD = .73)

Improved attitude towards parenting together - women: 4.29 (n = 468, SD = .80)

Improved attitude towards parenting together - men: 4.33 (n = 439, SD = .78)

Locke & Wallace “Marital Adjustment Scale” – Wording adapted for unmarried couples

Improved adjustment score – women: 75.6 % (total n = 234, mean change = 12.67)

Improved adjustment score – men 77.2% (total n = 224, mean change = 11.41)

Change range was -70 to +83 for women and -91 to + 63 for men with SD > 20
and any interpretation must be very guarded.

Child and Family Associated Consultants “FRAME-Works Scale” – created for this program based on the “Love’s Cradle” curriculum (Range 16 to 80)

Improved “Love’s Cradle” skills – women: 75.4% (total n = 240, mean change = -5.91)

Improved “Love’s Cradle” skills – men: 66.8% (total n = 229, mean change = -3.82)

Change range was -41 to + 19 for women, SD = 8.5, and -29 to + 16 for men,
SD = 7.7, therefore a guarded interpretation is recommended.

Administration for Children and Families OLDC (On-Line Data Collection) Skills Scores:

6a Improved communication - women: 74.7% (total n = 277)

Improved communication - men: 64.8% (total n = 256)

6b Improved conflict resolution skills - women: 74.5% (total n = 275)

Improved conflict resolution skills - men: 67.7% (total n = 257)

6c Improved abuse prevention* skills - women: 58.0% (total n = 281)

Improved abuse prevention* skills - men: 52.5% (total n = 270)

(* Couples at high risk were screened out of the program.)

6d Improved money management skills - women: 63.1% (total n = 233)

Improved money management skills - men: 55.6 % (total n = 216)

8a Improved attitude towards marriage - women: 33.7% (total n = 282)

Improved attitude towards marriage - men: 36.3% (total n = 270)
